Dr. Tarolli is a movement disorder neurologist at the University of Rochester with a focus on patients with advanced neurodegenerative conditions and high symptom burden. In addition to his clinical work, Dr. Tarolli is involved in clinical research evaluating the optimal methods to assess for and manage symptoms among those with Parkinson disease and related disorders, as well as methods to expand the reach and impact of medical care through the use of technology. Dr. Tarolli is highly involved in neurological education and educational scholarship. He is the director of the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry's neuroscience course for medical students, and his educational scholarship focuses on the impact of neurophobia on the medical workforce and its downstream effects on patients.

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
